LOCATION:

West one-half of the Southeast one-quarter of Section 1, T36S, R4W, Willamette Meridian,

Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To monument the parcels as shown on the

attached map.

PROCEDURE:

After finding the Section Corner monuments as shown on the attached map, I ran a traverse around the exterior boundary of said Section 1. A thorough search was made for the East one-quarter corner of said Section Since nothing could be found, I set a 5/8 inch iron pin for said East one-quarter corner from which:

A 12" pine bears \$43°E 29.1', scribed 286, B.T.

A 15" oak bears S35°W 8.3', scribed \S1, B.T.

A search was made for the West one-quarter corner of said Section 1 also. It is evident that a fire has been in this area. Apparently said fire distroyed the bearing trees, for no evidence of the corner could be found. I set a 5/8 inch pin at the correct proportioned distance for said onequarter corner from which:
A 12" fir bears S78°E 22.5', scribed

½S1, B.T. A 8" oak bears S18°E 14.5°, scribed \S1, B.T.

At the center of said Section 1, I set a 5/8 inch iron pin in a small mound of rocks from which:

A 20" fir bears N72°E 27.41, scribed

C.S.1, B.T. A 12" oak bears S20°W 28.4', scribed C.S.1, B.T.

At the center East one-sixteenth corner of said Section 1, I set a 5/8 inch pin in a mound of rocks from which:

A 8" oak bears N57°E 17.1', scribed

C.E.1/16, B.T. A 12" twin oak bears \$8°W 24.1', scribed C.E.1/16, B.T.

At the East one-sixteenth corner common to Sections 1 and 12, I set a 5/8 inch pin in a mound of rocks from which:
