A thorough search for the one quarter corner was made without success; a search for the line tree recovered a 41-inch diameter pine with 2 healed notches on north and south faces of tree. Borings were made in the respective notches with ring counts dating to Circa 1883.

Utilizing the recovered line tree new search areas were determined for the one quarter corner. A thorough search was again made of these areas without success. I therefore reestablish this corner as shown on the attached map of survey.
