PURPOSE:

To monument a line by the testimony of our client and a letter (attached) from Mrs. Minnie E. Hansen, who formerly owned the property East of our client's property.

The fence called for in the letter as being the boundary is gone now except for the section indicated on the annexed map, but there are marks on a large pine tree near the angle point on the monumented line that appear to have been caused by an attached fence.

The "testimony line", being located in Section 10, T36SR3W, W.M., is in no way intended to represent the Deed line or the record line.

Recorded Survey Nos. 622 and 2221 do not indicate what monuments (if any) were set. No monuments were found along the "testimony line" except a 1/2" rebar of unknown origin located at the Northwesterly terminus thereof.

PROCEDURE:

Monuments shown on the annexed map were set along the said testimony line as directed by our client.

A closed EDM traverse was run to the 1/4 corner common to Sections 10 and 11, T36SR3W, W.M., being a Bureau of Land Management brass cap monument, and a tie was computed to the most Northerly monument set on this survey.

Basis of bearings is a mean of 8 solar observations.
