PROCEDURE:

Prior to commencement of this survey, I began with an investigation of corner control. Controlling section corners had been recovered and remonumented by the Jackson County Surveyor. The one-quarter corner common to Sections 27 and 34 had not been recovered. With the required corner control recovered and verified, I performed a closed traverse tying required corners. From this data a search area was determined for the missing one-quarter corner. A thorough search was performed for original evidence of the missing one-quarter corner without success. This corner had previously been search for by Medford Corporation surveyors also without success. Unable to locate any evidence of this corner I reestablished this corner at proportional measurement as shown on the attached map.

This survey was performed utilizing a Wild T2 Theodolite and Hewlett Packard 3808A Electronic Distance Meter.
