HISTORY OF SURVEYS

LEGEND

Brass Cap

The exterior boundary lines and the subdivision lines of Township 40 South, Range 4 West, W.M. were surveyed by Samuel Lackland under G.L.O. contract No. 429 dated January 5, 1882.

The section corner common to sections 16,17,20 and 21, Township 40 South, Range 4 West was re-established by Fred W. Rodolph under GLO. contract in 1917.

The West 1/4 corner, North 1/4 corner and Southeast section corner of section 20, Township 40 South, Range 4 West were re-monumented by Rollin D. Aanrud, U.S. cadastrol surveyor of the B.L.M. in 1966.

The section corner common to sections 16,17,20 and 21, Township 40 South, Range 4 West, W.M was re-established a second time by the Jackson County surveyor April 21, 1977.

The 1/4 corner common to sections 20 and 29, Township 40 South, Range 4 West was re-established by the Jackson County surveyor February 22, 1979.

The South 1/16 corner common to sections 19 and 20, Township 40 South, Range 4 West was established by Harold Center of the U.S. Forest Service July 31,1980. (RS 8492)

The East 1/16 corner common to sections 20 and 29, Township 40 South, Range 4 West, W.M. was established by H. Leon Kennedy under contract with the U.S. Forest Service August 18, 1980. (RS 8593)





PURPOSE:

To establish, post and blaze the National Forest boundary lines, to perform necessary maintenance on the controlling corner monuments, and to monument the interior corner points as shown on the accompanying plat.

PRYCEDURE:

A search of the available records revealed the History of Surveys as stated on the accompanying plat. Upon locating the controlling monuments I ran a random traverse through each monument setting control points as required for posting. Using the data thus obtained I computed the corner positions and offsets to true line from the control points. I then posted and blazed the property lines as required. The Fast quarter corner was set at a proportional split per original government records. The other corners were set at calculated positions with accessories as described below.
