

## SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

: To monument the corners of 0.R. 67-11420 and certain other Purpose

> corners relative to OR 77-08185 as shown on the attached plat in accordance with the instructions of the client, Mr.

Martindale.

## Procedure

Measurements were made with theodolite and electronic distance measuring equipment. Vertical angles were doubled, horizontal angles were closed and digital readouts were observed in the foot and meter mode.

Angle check was made against two different surveys and a coordinate check was also obtained relative to the existing road right-of-way monuments shown.

To determine the location of the north line of OR 77-08185 (dashed line), a right angle from the section line was held. This was believed the intent of the deed. If, however, the intent was to be 330 feet due North of the section line, the procedure adopted would result in a monument location several hundredths of a foot too far North.

The west line of O.R. 67-11420 was held at record South. However, the intent of the deed may have been, in this case, to be at a right angle from the section line. Should this prove true, the monument location is too far East by 4.02 feet.

This surveyor does not possess any information relative to intent in the two instances above mentioned.

Much uncertainty has heretofore existed in this area prior to the recovery of the southeast corner of Section 2. Accordingly, the location of certain tax lot lines have been assumed resulting, in some instances, in unintentional occupation of adjoining properties and mislocation of improvements.

This situation has been observed in two separate instances during the course of this survey, one involving the north and west line of the 1.118 acre tract shown. It is to be hoped that reasonable boundary line adjustments can be effected amicably between adjoiners in such cases.
