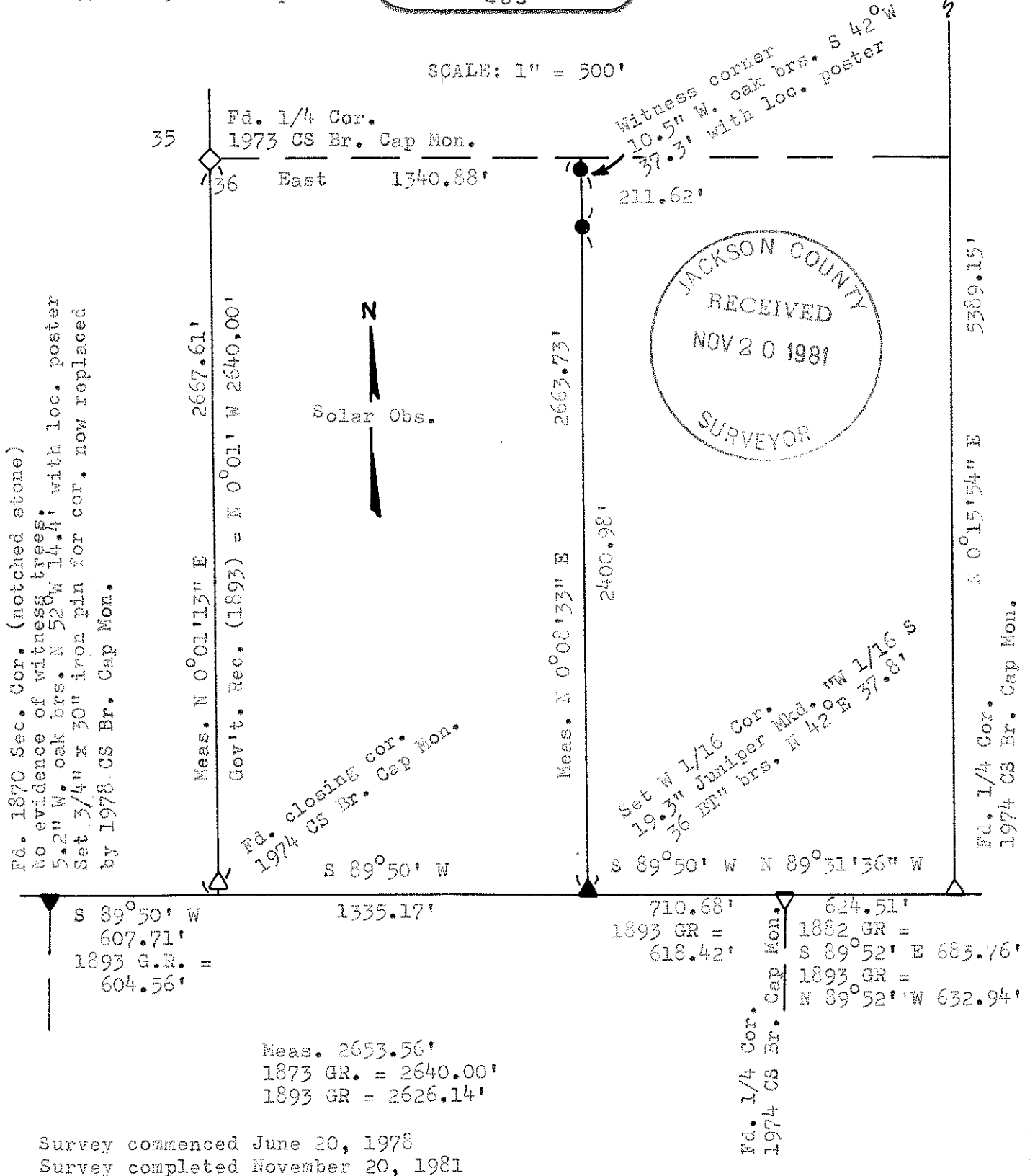

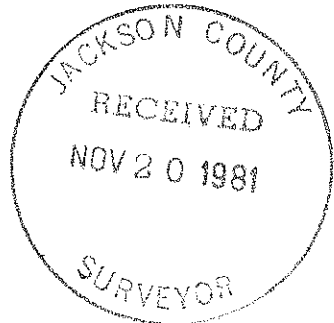

line construction.

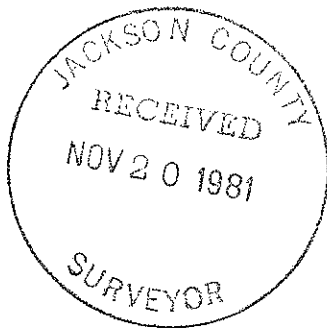
Procedure

Corner ties were obtained utilizing electronic distance measuring equipment.

The client initially was desirous of setting the CW 1/16 corner of Section 36 which would have required appropriate additional work.

Economic considerations apparently considered, such additional work was not mutually agreed upon and the plat of survey was completed in the absence of a response from the client.
