

It was necessary to determine the East line as well as the position of the East quarter corner of Section 6. No record was found for the remonumentation of said quarter corner. A monument set by Everett Swain was found as shown on the recorded plat of a "Minor Land Partition" recorded in Volume 4, Page 46 of "Minor Land Partitions in Jackson County, Oregon. This plat is also reference by the County Surveyor as Survey No. 8936. This found monument is not referred to by Mr. Swain as the quarter corner. It is shown only as a point in the center of Ashland Mine Road and at the terminus of a Boundary Line Agreement. I surveyed through this monument and the monumented positions of the Northeast and Southeast corners of Section 6. A proportion position for the quarter corner falls approximately South 6 feet and West 12 feet from the found monument. Through a search of the County road records and road survey notes it was found that the centerline of the Ashland Mine Road was the East line of Section 6, from station 34.01 chains to station 73.27 chains.

Ties were made in the field to the physical apparent centerline points of intersection along Ashland Mine Road. These were then compared with the call made for the quarter corner on the road centerline. The position of the quarter corner determined by the road information was found to be within a few tenths of a foot of Mr. Swain's monument. Recovery of two Madrone clusters in the vicinity of mile post no. 1 on Ashland Mine Road further substantiated the ties and computations I had made with reference to the original road survey of 1892.

Because of the extreme close proximity of our computed position of the quarter corner to the monument Mr. Swain set, I accepted said monument as the quarter corner.

The North 1/16 corner common to Sections 5 and 6 was monumented, as well as those property corners shown on the accompanying map.

The following accessories were tied at the Northeast corner of Section 6:

White Oak 7" dia. bears N81°41'E 40.7 ft. (rec. N81°35'E 40.90 ft.) 1 1/2" inside dia. iron pipę, flush with the ground, pinched top bears S47°03'21"E 23.13 ft. (rec. S46°58'50"E 23.14 ft.) White Oak 9" dia. bears S27°33'E 50.9 ft. (rec. S27°31'E 51.49 ft.) P. Pine 18" Dia. bears N29°59'E 43.6 ft.(record)

White Oak 9" dia. bears S37°26'W 34.1 ft. (rec. S37°31'W 34.13 ft.) Incense Cedar 11" dia. bears S64°29'W 15.4 ft. (rec. S65°09'W 15.61 ft.) White Oak 10" dia. bears N47°12'W 29.7 ft. (rec. N47°16'W 30.10 ft.)

Bearing was based on a solar observation.

Location: Located in the Northeast quarter of Section 6,

Township 39 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

To monument the three existing parcels of land Purpose:

as shown on the accompanying map.

Procedure:

An in depth review of the chain of title of the subject parcels revealed that the three parcels of land should be surveyed as described. The most northerly parcel was conveyed by George Billings to Patrick via deed record Volume 15. Page 622, dated May 31, 1888. It is imperative to note that at that time Billings own the adjoining property to the North and West of this parcel and had convey the parcel to the South via deed record Volume 15, Page 403 on April 18, 1888. The first deed (Volume 15, Page 403) excepted, by metes and bounds, the exact discription found in Volume 15, Page 622. This evidence firmly establishes the senior rights of the most North-erly parcel shown on the accompanying map.

An interesting situation arises with the location of Patrick Lane, in that it was deeded to the County by deed record Volume 86, Page 435. The description contained therein calls for the North 20 feet of the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter and the South 20 feet of Northeast the Northeast quarter of Section 6. quarter of The deed did not follow the metes and bounds description of the previously conveyed parcel to the South. A subdivision of Section 6 would be required to determine the described right-ofway of Patrick Lane, however, such a subdivision is unnecessary for locating Mr. O'Dell's property. Because of these facts I have made note on the "Map of Survey" that the right-of-way of Patrick Lane was not determined. It should also be noted that the possibility exists for a gap or overlap to exist along the South line of Patrick Lane.

The Goodman parcel and the Muhs parcel were created out of that tract described in said deed record Volume 15, Page 403. The location of each of these parcels is controlled by its respective description. In these descriptions the Section line is referred to as having a bearing of South. I therefore held the West lines of these parcels parallel with the Section line.
