- Bearing are based on a solar observation taken at the S.W. Corner Section 16; additional check solar taken; 1300ft. North of S.W. Corner Section 9; at the N. 1/4 Corner Section 8; 1600ft. East of N.W. Corner Section 10; 1300ft. North of S.E. Corner Section 10; & 200' North of E. 1/4 Corner Section 16.
- All B.T.'s have 6" painted red band; painted faces; an Attention sign on the back; B.T. tags.
- All new B.T.'s marked also have a 3/4" brass washer stamped RLS 601 on lower face.
- A 6ft. metal post with either an Attention sign, or a Land Survey Monument sign was placed at each corner.

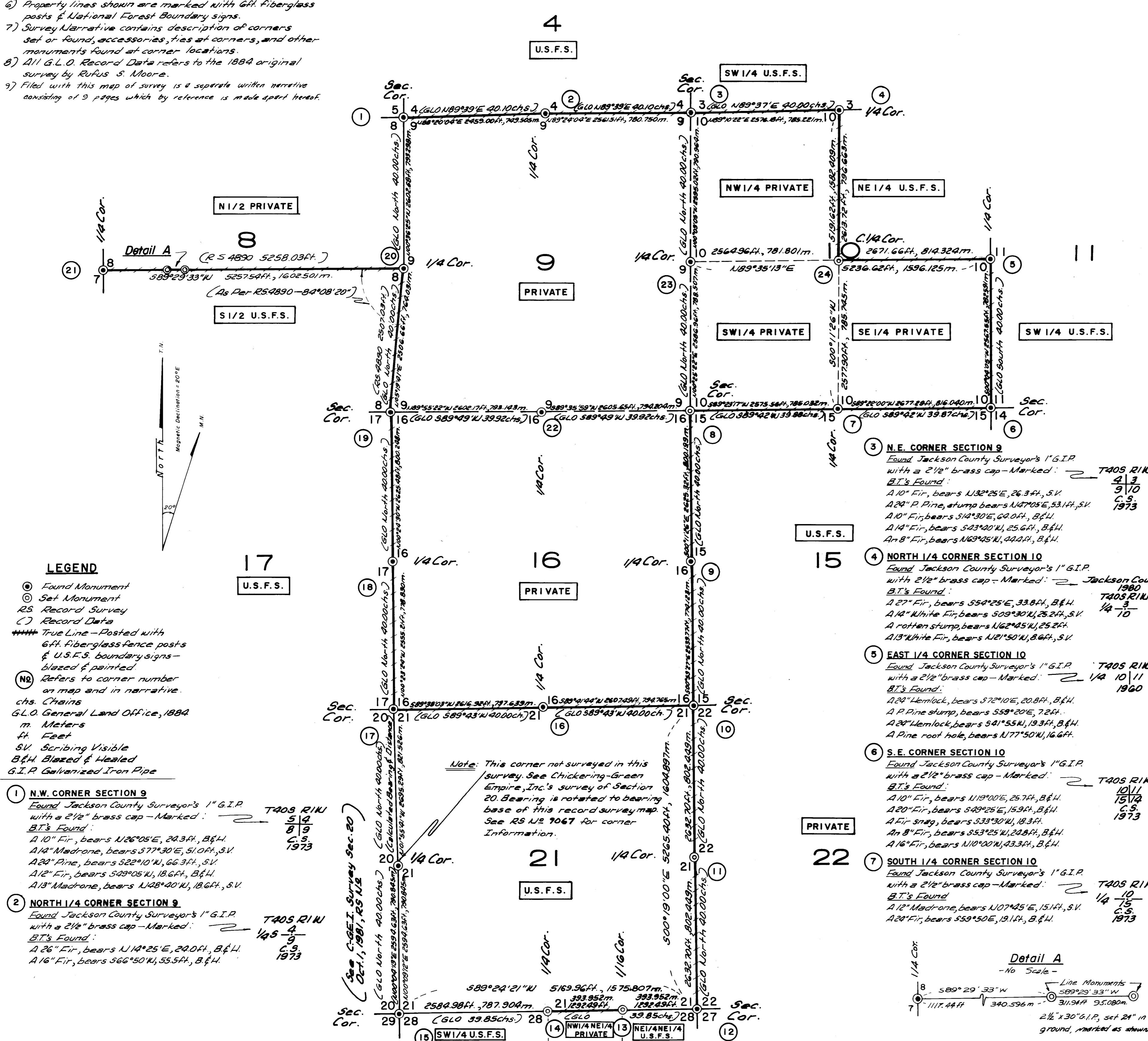
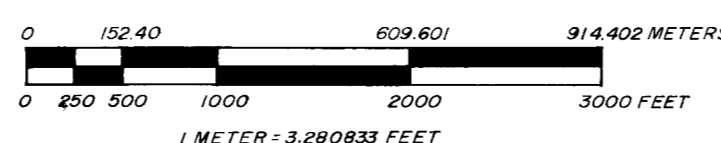
HISTORY OF SURVEYS

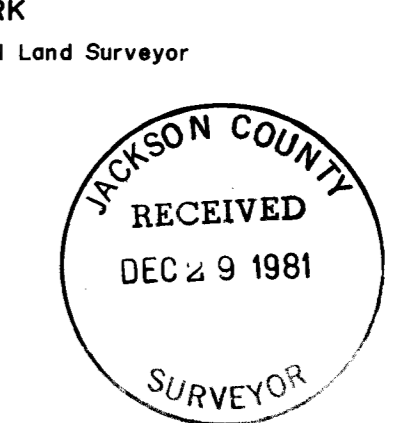

I, Dean Pruett of Medford, Oregon, do hereby acknowledge that I am a Timber Cruiser for Timber Products Company of Medford, Oregon and state that while cruising timber in the year 1962 I did find the following evidence of the Section Corner common to Section 9, 10, 15 and 16, T. 40 S., R. 1 W., W.M. located Westerly of Ditch Creek Road, Jackson County, Oregon. I did at that time observe evidence, believed by me to be original evidence, to wit:


- a Fir stob probably of an original bearing tree;
- a pile of rocks probably locating the section corner location, may or may not be of original nature;
- a cruiser's mark, known by me to be that of Yocum, a mark such as  made on or about 1940;
- it is believed to me that Yocum was also a compassman for a man by the name of Cox who probably located this corner 10-15 years prior to Yocum cruise.

I have also initialed and dated, this date, a Xerox copy of a cruise report which is dated 1/29/1940 - 2/1/1940 which is in the possession of the Forestry Department of Timber Products Company, Medford, Oregon, attached hereto and marked EXHIBIT 'A' of this affidavit.

I also know that the cruiser Yocum always tried to put his cruiser's mark on dominant, good trees closest to and facing the corner location, as this mark did.



Purpose: To blaze and post the boundaries of the U. S. Forest Service lands in Sections 8, 9, 10, 16 and 21, and to establish and re-establish certain corners as shown on the map of survey.

Procedure: Basis of bearing is a solar observation taken near the Southwest corner of Section 16, Township 40 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian. Additional check solar observations were taken, to verify angular accuracy, at five other locations as indicated under Notes on the map of survey.

All corners set in this survey were set in accordance with procedures outlined in the B.L.M. Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973. The center 1/4 corner of Section 10 was set at the intersection of the North-South and East-West centerlines. The East 1/4 corner of Section 21 and the South 1/4 corner of Section 21 were set by single proportionate measurement after a search for original evidence produced no evidence of the original corners. The East 1/16th corner between Sections 21 and 28 was set by single proportionate measurement. The plat used as the basis of proportionate measurement is Rufus S. Moore's plat, approved April 10, 1884.

Closed random traverses were run in the approximate locations of lines to be marked. Offsets from the random lines were made to the property lines which were blazed, painted and posted with 6 foot fiberglass fence posts with National Forest Boundary signs.

All B.T.'s found or set have a 6" red band of paint, B.T. Tags and Attention Signs. An Attention Sign or a Land Survey Monument Sign was set at each corner surveyed to or set. All new B.T.'s marked have a 3/4" brass washer stamped "LS601" nailed on the lower face.
