At the corner point I found a 26-inch by 20-inch by 6-inch diameter basalt stone with 1/4 marked on the north face of the stone. I find no evidence of the original accessories marked to reference this corner point.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner: I remove said stone monument and at the exact corner point I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter galvanized iron post with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter brass cap attached. I mark the brass cap as shown in the corner diagram in the upper right of this document.

From which the following references:

A 13-inch diameter hemlock bears S.19° 22'E. 18.18 feet distance, scribed 1/4S4LS1071 BT.

A 26-inch diameter fir bears N.25° 33'W. 95.12 feet distance, scribed 1/4S33LS1071 BT.

Note - South bank of the middle fork of the Rogue River bears North 15.00 feet distance.

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Original corner point was established by Rufus S. Moore under Contract No. 504 dated May 27, 1884. At the original corner point Moore set a 14-inch by 10-inch by 10-inch stone marked with 3 notches on the east and west edges of said stone.

From which the following references:

- A fir 6-inches in diameter bears N.47°E. 23 links.
- A hemlock 12-inches in diameter bears S.32°E. 26 links.
- A fir 8-inches in diameter bears S.15°W. 19 links.
- A fir 15-inches in diameter bears N.28°W. 10 links.

Description of corner evidence found:

At the corner point I found, firmly set, a 13-inch by 10-inch by 10-inch diameter stone marked with 3 groves on the east and 2 full groves and a portion of the third grove on the west side of said stone. The only remains of the original accessories marked by Moore are a root hole depression, 14-inches in diameter, bears N.27°58'W. 7.28 feet distance. No evidence of remaining trees were identified.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

I remove said stone and at the exact corner point I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter galvanized iron post with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter brass cap marked as shown in the corner diagram in the upper right of this document.

A 59-inch diameter pine bears S.76°48'W. 19.15 feet distance, scribed T33SR4ES4LS1071 BT.

A 23-inch diameter fir bears N.11°27'W. 62.86 feet distance, scribed T32SR4ES33LS1071


