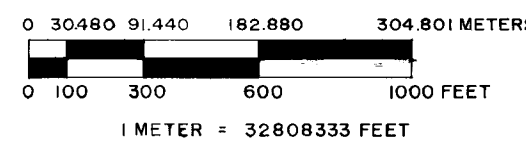


SURVEY FOR THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE

Filed with this map of survey is a separate written narrative consisting of 10 pages which by reference is made a part hereof.

NOTES-SECTIONS 15 & 16

- 1) Bearings are based on a solar observation taken at the North 1/4 Corner of Section 16, T.34S., R.2E., W.M.
- 2) All B.T.'s have a 6" painted red band, painted faces, an Attention sign on the back, and a B.T. tag.
- 3) All new B.T.'s marked also have a 3/4" brass washer stamped LS 601 nailed on the lower face.
- 4) A 6ft. fence post with an Attention sign or a Land Survey Monument sign was placed near each corner.
- 5) Survey Method & Equipment: Wild-T-16, Wild-D12-Distomat, and a TS10 Topcon Guppy.
- 6) Property lines shown are marked with 6ft. posts and National Forest Boundary signs, lines blazed and painted; one quarter blazes are on U.S.F.S. property, and facing blazes on private property.
- 7) Bearings & distances shown from Record Survey 2953 are to the corners of this survey, but not always to identical monument positions - See Narrative & Sketches.

HISTORY OF SURVEYS-SECTIONS 15 & 16

- 1) Section 16 was surveyed by Nathaniel Ford, Contract N# 58, plat approved July 7, 1856.
- 2) Section 15 was surveyed by E.B. Henry, General Land Office, Contract N# 774, plat approved October 13, 1909.
- 3) The B.L.M. re-monumented certain corners in Sections 15 & 16 in 1974 under General Special Instructions, Group 350, Oregon, dated May 3, 1957, approved August 17, 1973 & August 17, 1978.
- 4) Section 15 was surveyed and subdivided by Duane A. Smeltzer, P.L.S. #61, Recorded Survey N# 2953, Jackson County Surveyor's Office, filed January 5, 1965.
- 5) The South & East lines of Section 16 was surveyed by K.C. Kleaver, P.L.S. #679, Recorded Survey N# 7401, Jackson County Surveyor's Office, filed September 1, 1978.

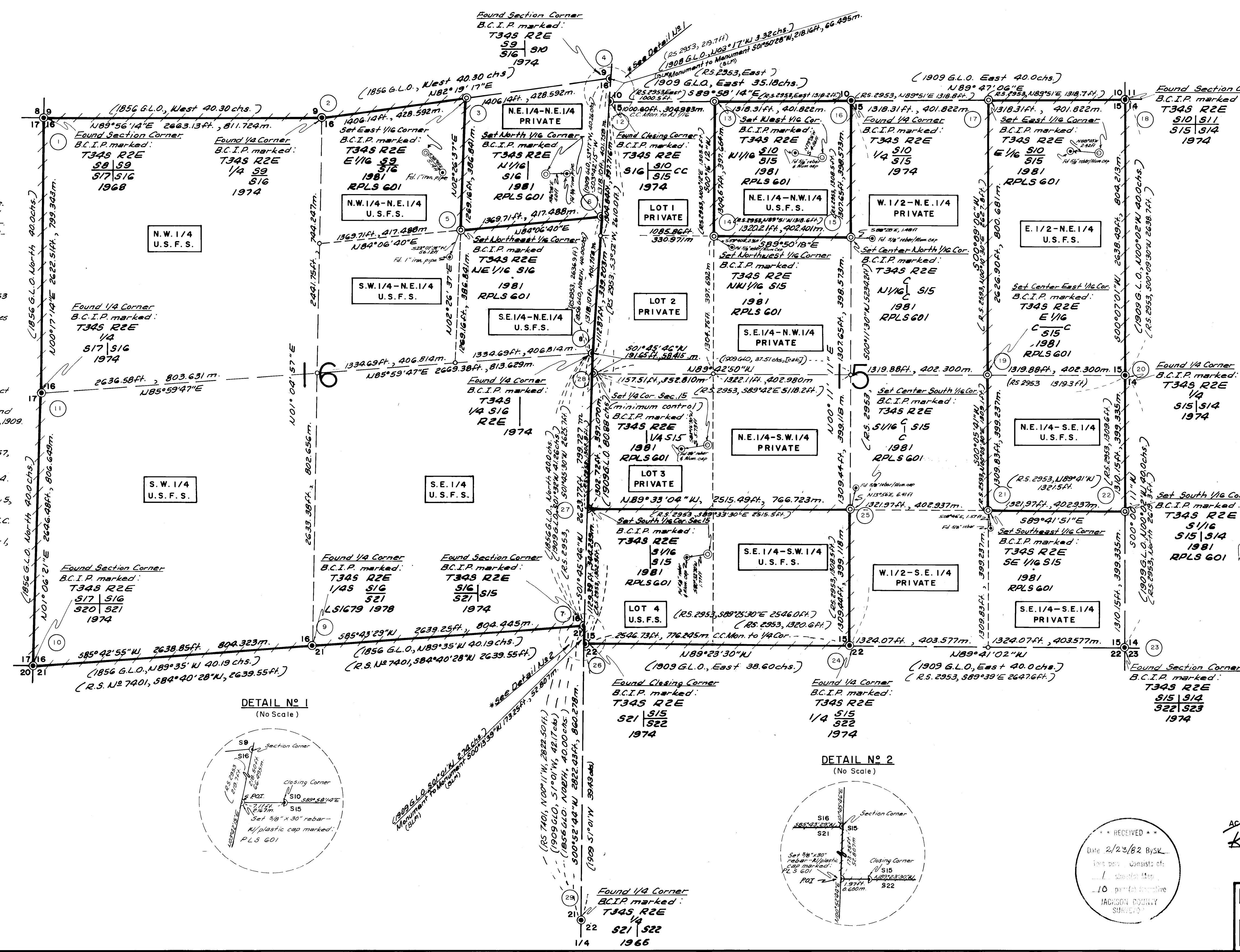

(continued)

A closed random traverse was run in the approximate location of property lines to be marked. Offsets from the random lines were made to the property line which was blazed, painted and posted with 6 foot aluminum fence post with National Forest boundary signs.

All B.T.'s found or set have a 6" red band of paint, B.T. tags and Attention Signs. An Attention Sign or a Land Survey Monument Sign was set at each corner surveyed to or set. All new B.T.'s marked have a 3/4" brass washer stamped LS601 nailed on the lower face.

Purpose: To blaze and post the boundaries of the U. S. Forest Service land in Sections 15 and 16, and establish the West one quarter corner to Section 15 only, Township 34 South, Range 2 East, Willamette Meridian and various corners of the U. S. Forest Service lands lying in Sections 15 and 16.

Procedure: Basis of bearing is a solar observation taken at the North one quarter corner of Section 16, Township 34 South, Range 2 East, Willamette Meridian. The West one quarter corner of Section 15 only was set holding a mid-point latitude position between the Northwest and the Southwest corners of said Section 15. Departure control for Section 15 was holding senior corners marking the East line of Section 16. Both Sections 15 and 16 were subdivided as shown on the map in accordance to the B.L.M. Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973.

Section 16, Township 34 South, Range 2 East, Willamette Meridian was surveyed by Nathaniel Ford, plat approved July 6, 1856. Section 15 was surveyed by E. B. Henry, General Land Office, plat approved October 15, 1909.

Section 15, Township 34 South, Range 2 East, Willamette Meridian was later subdivided by Duane A. Smeltzer, PLS 461, map of survey filed January 5, 1965, Recorded Survey No. 2953 Jackson County Surveyor's Office.

The original corners found along the East line of Section 16 were held as senior corners, original corners found along the West line of Section 15 were treated as closing corners(junior).
