

PURPOSE

Showing that the Southerly Boundary of the Cronin tract adjoins the Northerly edge of Ashland Mine Road rights of way for a distance of 1023 feet.



Thirdly I located the Southwest corner of said Section 6 and traversed between the corners located as well as along the Ashland Mine Road in question.

The location of the existing Ashland Mine Road, relative to Cronins deed, and Ager's survey-description and monuments, and Applegate's survey as used for the Ashland Mine Road dedication, are all shown on the attached survey map. Given the fact that the 1892 Ashland Mine Road Dedication calls for a roadway 40-feet in width, "20 feet on each side of the line described in said Surveyors report", this survey has determined that Cronin's southerly property line coincides with the dedicated and existing Ashland Mine Road for a distance of approximately 1023 feet.

BASIS OF BEARING:

I made an observation of Polaris at elongation between the hours of 8:30 and 9:15 p.m., March 12, 1982, within which time Polaris was North 01°05'42" West of true North. I turned an angle from said Polaris observation at that time to a point on this survey to establish a basis for bearings of this survey.

LOCATION: In the Southwest Quarter of Section 6, Township 39 South, Range 1 East of

the Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

FOR: Bill Cronin, 816 W. 10th Street, Medford, Oregon

PURPOSE: To determine if a portion of Bill Cronin's southerly property line, as surveyed and monumented by Jackson County Registered Survey Number 1767

(L.E. Ager, August 18, 1961), and as described in the Deed for Bill Cronin's property, coincides with or is contained within the right-of-way of the Ashland Mine Road.

Agers Survey No. 1767 and the description of Cronin's property are both referenced by ties to the Southwest Corner of said Section 6. Peter Applegate's survey of the center-line of Ashland Mine Road, made in 1892 by Deputy County Surveyor, M.L. McCall, and as used as the basis for dedication of the Ashland Mine Road as a "public highway" by the Jackson County Commissioners on June 9, 1892 (see Commissioners Journal, pages 382-385) also ties the Ashland Mine Road to the Southwest Corner of said Section 6.

County Surveyor Applegate's notes and the "Dedication" declare that the center-line of the Ashland Mine Road as surveyed was also the center-line of an existing road. Consequently the existing roadway, if there now appears to be no evidence of other old adjacent roadways, might be considered as a monument of the location of the Ashland Mine Road as dedicated in 1892. Therefore, I proceeded to determine, by survey and platting, the relationship between the Ashland Mine Road as it exists (or might have existed by evidence of former roadway evidence) and the Ashland Mine Road as described by Applegate's notes in the Dedication and, also, the location of Cronin's southerly property line as described in his deed and as shown and monumented by Ager's survey.

First of all I made a diligent search of the land adjacent to the existing roadway to determine if a road might have existed in former times in a different location. I found no such evidence and am satisfied the present roadway must have been the roadway surveyed by Deputy McCall in 1892.

Secondly I located the 3/4-inch iron pipe monuments set alongside the existing Ashland Mine Road by Ager to delineate the location of Cronin's southerly line in question.
