



An Ordinance to change the location and establish that portion of Granite street in the City of Ashland Jackson County State of Oregon in this Ordinance described.

The Reople of the City of Ashland do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the report of the City Surveyor

which is as follows, viz:

To the Hon Mayor and Conneil of the City of Ashland, Oregon:

to your order of November 2nd 1891 I have made survey and plat showing a change in a part of Granite street as follows, To-wit:

Beginning at a point on section line in the center of Granite street in the city of Ashland, Oregon, 141 too feet Easterly from the corner of sections 8,9,16, and 17 in township 39 south of sange one cast of the Willamette Meridian. Oregon: thener North 0°35' west 138 to feet; thener North 16° 50' west 491 feet to a piece of one inch iron pipe two feet long driven in the ground on the line between sections 8 and 9 in said township and range; thence north 25° 35' west 204 to feet to an iron pin at the intersection of the center lines of granite 15 treet and Hargadine avenue

The Easterly, Southerly and a portion of the Westerly and Northerly boundary lines were flagged with fluorescent ribbon to indicate the approximate boundary lines between set monuments.

See Exhibits 'A' 'B' 'C' and 'D', attached hereto and incorporated herein and thereby made a part of this report.

The remainder of the survey is as set forth on the attached map.

reject the call for said pipe, by Lynn M. Roseberry, Cadastral Surveyor for the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, as being the section corner. Reference: Field Notes of the Corrective Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines and Subdivisional Lines of Section 17, and the Remonumentation of an Original Corner Point, Township 39 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in the State of Oregon. Executed by Lynn M. Roseberry, Cadastral Surveyor under special instructions dated May 3 1957, approved May 6, 1957; Special Instructions dated March 23, 1960, approved March 24, 1960; Supplemental Special Instructions dated June 1, 1976, approved June 2, 1976 which provided for the surveys included under Group Numbers 350 and 434, and assignment instuctions dated July 19, 1976.

Survey commenced July 19, 1976 Survey ended July 23, 1976

Now turning to the quarter corner common to Sections 16 and 21, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, I have search for this corner for the past several years. No records have been uncovered, up to this point in time, that would suggest this corner was in existence or was found by anyone after the original government survey. Another search was made at this time with still negative results. Therefore, at a proportioned corner location I set the following:

1/4 SECTION CORNER common Sections 16 and 21, Township 39 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Base and Meridian.

At the corner point set a 40 inch long by 1 inch diameter galvanized iron pipe, 39 inches in the ground with a 2 1/2 inch diameter bronze cap marked:

Survey Monument 1982 in a mound of stones from which:

A Granite Boulder, 18"x 30" x ?, exposed 30 inches at Southerly face bears North 19°31' East, 48.66 feet to a chiseled "+" with letters "BO" for Bearing Object placed above said chiseled "+".

A Douglas Fir, 9 inches DBH, bears South $75^{\circ}09'$ West, 22.72 feet to center of tree, scribed 1/4 S 21 BT.

A Douglas Fir, 14 inches DBH, bears North 33°10' West, 38.28 feet to center of tree, scribed 1/4 S 16 BT.

A dry draw ^C North 66° East - South 66° West bears North 33°10' West, 18.8 feet to approximate center.

Witness: Robert Malotte

Along the Westerly boundary line of the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of the Northwest quarter of said Section 16, there exist a fence encroachment. Witness corners were set on the North and West boundary lines near the location of said fence.

On February 16, 1886, M.L. McCall made two (2) surveys for W.H. Wickam wherein he commenced his surveys at the section corner common to Sections 8, 9, 16 and 17, T.39S. R.1E See Field Book #5 (C) pages 98 and 99.

On June 27, 1891, M.L. McCall conducted a survey for C.P. Jones which is as follows: "To change part of Granite Street in Ashland Or.

Begin at a stake in center of Granite St. & on line bet Secs 9 & 16, T39S R1E WM or 141.75 ft East of SW cor said Sec 9. thence N.0°35'W. 138.1 ft N.16°50W 491 " to a piece of iron pipe 1" dia drove in center of said Granite st on line bet Secs 8 & 9 in said T & R. thence N.25°33'W. 204.1' to intersection of the center line of Granite St with the center line of Hargadine Avenue." See Field Book # 1 (A) page 85.

Apparently Ashland City Ordinance No. 112, which was adopted by the City Council of Ashland, Oregon and approved by the Mayor on January 4, 1892 was a direct result of the survey McCall shows conducting for C.P. Jones on June 27, 1891. See copy of City Ordinance attached hereto and made a part of this report.

With the above references to said section corner, I now want to go to F.H. Walker's Field Book #3, commonly referred to as the "tie book". On page 33 there are diagrams showing what was at the section corner common to Sections 8, 9, 16 and 17 and the 1/4 corner common to Sections 8 and 9. It should be noted that the Twp is 39 South, but the Range is erroneously shown as 2 East instead of 1 East. This error is obvious as no street by the name of Granite Street or no band stand in a city park exist in Twp. 39 South, Range 2 East that I am aware of. Now returning to the explanation of the section corner; said diagram shows a "stone with X" at the corner common to Sections 8, 9, 16 and 17, T.39S. R. IE. there also shows "pipe on S. side of stone" and graphically shows the pipe being Southerly of said section corner. A 1/2 inch iron pipe is shown in Granite Street which is Easterly of said section corner. Now, to further illustrate the point that the pipe at the vicinity of the section corner common to Sections 8, 9, 16 and 17 is not the true section corner, the quarter corner common to Sections 8 and 9 is shown on the same page of the same field book. As hereinabove provided, M.L. Mc Call set a sandstone at the quarter corner on March 7, 1890 (Ashland Survey Book titled "Ashland Surveys" page 74). This tie information in F.H. Walker's Field Book #3 page 33 shows a "+ stone with +" at the quarter corner common to Sections 8 and 9. He further shows graphically and states "2" pipe on side".

Another City of Ashland loose leaf binder titled "Interesection Ties" shows evidence of stones being situated at both the quarter corner and section corner in question. Therefore, with that survey filed in the office of Jackson County Surveyor as No. 8239, showing the relationship of the retracement of the various monuments elucidated hereinabove, survey No. 8239 shows the positioning of the True location of the section corner common to Sections 8, 9, 16 and 17, Township 39 South, Range 1 East to be Northwesterly of said existing pipe and as shown in the various tie books in the possession of the City of Ashland. This true position would also correlate with the surveys as called for by M.L. McCall. Therefore, I find it necessary to

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

SURVEY FOR:

LOCATION:

Situated in the Northwest quarter of Section 16, Township 39 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Base and Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To establish and monument the boundaries of the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 16, Township 39 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Base and Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PROCEDURE:

First of all, the question of the location of the section corner common to Sections 8, 9, 16 and 17, said Township and Range should be explored. It has been suggested in the past, that a 2 inch iron pipe in the vicinity of said section corner has been thought by some, to be the position of said section corner. I do now and I did then, as shown on Recorded Survey No. 8239, take exception to the 2 inch pipe being called the section corner and the following data will provide information to support that position. On March 28, 1889, M.L. McCall divided the South half of the Southwest quarter of Section 9, Township 39 South, Range 1 East as shown in Field Book 'A', page 117. The monument found at the West 1/16 corner common to Sections 9 and 16, is of the type commonly set by McCall. Also, the retracement of McCall's survey line and monuments (see Recorded Survey No. 8239) shows a very consistent relationship to those values as set forth in said Field Book 'A' On June 5, 1894, M.L. McCall conducted the following:

"Survey for City changing part of Terrace St."
"Begin at standard iron pin at NW cor of NE⁴ of NW⁴ of Sec. 16. T.39S. R.1E."
thence

see Field Book #1 (A) page 162
Further evidence of said iron pin (called iron bar by this surveyor, E.L. Swain) is indicated in a survey of Glenview Drive by Walker and McKissick on May 11 and 12, 1914 for the City of Ashland. See Field Book 'J' page 43.

On September 23, 1889, M.L. McCall made a survey for W.H. Wickam wherein he started at an "iron pin or a piece of galvanized pipe, 24"x1" on section line bet secs 8 & 9, 9.24 chains North of cor. common to Secs. 8, 9, 16 & 17, T.39S R.1E. W.M. in center of Granite St." and proceeded to conduct his survey. See Field Book 'A' page 169.

On March 7, 1890, M.L. McCall proceeded to "survey to re-establish the 1/4 cor. bet Secs. 8 & 9, T.39S., R.1E. W.M." He further states "Begin at cor. to Secs. 8, 9, 16 & 17 and set a flag at cor. to Secs. 4, 5, 8 & 9. I find the course to be N.11'W. and the length of the line to be 79.89 chains and at 39.94 1/2 chs I set a sandstone 8 x 11 x 18 marked on E side 1/4 S. with X on top, hole drilled in center of cross for 1/4 cor." See City of Ashland survey book titled "Ashland Surveys" page 74.
