

At the corner point I found a firmly set 13-inch by 10-inch by 10-inch stone with 3 groves on the east and 2 full groves and a portion of a third on the west. PURPOSE:

To establish property corners and mark and post National Forest boundaries within Section 33.

PROCEDURE:

Prior to commencement of this survey an investigation of controlling section corners was made. The north, east and west one-quarter corners along with the southwest section corner had been remonumented from original evidence by either the Bureau of Land Management, Division of Cadastral Surveys, or the Jackson County Surveyor.

The northwest section corner and the west onesixteenth corner to Sections 28 and 33 had been monumented by Registered Professional Land Surveyor No. 1137, Donald L. Branch (Reference Jackson County Surveyor File Record Survey No. 8596).

The south one-quarter corner had not been recovered since the original establishment of the corner in 1884.

With the above controlling corners verified, I performed a series of traverse lines tying each corner point to part of a closed traverse. I extended my survey easterly to the one-quarter corner common to Section 35, Township 32 South, Range 4 East, and Section 2, Township 33 South, Range 4 East. Utilizing this corner and the southwest corner of Section 33, I computed search areas for corners along the south line of Sections 33 and 34. I then began a traverse at the southwest corner of Section 33 and ran a traverse line easterly tying topography called for within the original record along with blazed trees dating to the year of the original survey. From this data, a search area was determined for the southeast corner of Section 33. After a diligent search the original stone monument marking the corner point was recovered.

Utilizing the recovered southeast corner point a new search area was determined for the south one-quarter corner Section 33. After a diligent search the original stone marking the true corner point for this corner was also recovered. Each recovered point was remonumented as described within Record Survey No. 9146 on file with the Jackson County Surveyor.

With all required corner points recovered I proceeded to subdivide said section monumenting required corner points and posting property lines as required. Property lines were posted using aluminum posts with National Forest boundary signs attached. Trees along the property were blazed and painted with red timber marking paint.
