SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH O.R.S. 209.250

SURVEY FOR:

Boise Cascade Corporation Southern Oregon Region

P.O. Box 100 Medford, OR 97501

LOCATION:

A portion of Section 2, Township 32 South, Range 1 East, Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To survey, establish and mark the Boise Cascade Corporation's property lines as shown on the attached map.

PROCEDURE:

Traverses were run to the four one-quarter (1/4) section corners and the Northeast corner of said Section 2. Next a mathematical position was computed for the position of the center one-quarter (1/4) of Section 2. Then a traverse was run from the East one-quarter (1/4) corner to the center one-quarter (1/4) corner to the South one-quarter (1/4) corner. The Boise Cascade Corporation's property lines were marked with a combination of blazed and painted trees, and tags stamped PL BCC.

A 5/8" x 30" pin with a plastic cap was set at the center one-quarter (1/4) corner of Section 2 from which:

A 10" Fir bears S 23° W 16.6 feet, scribed C 1/4 S2, BT
A 6" Fir bears S 89° W 11.2 feet, scribed C 1/4 S2, BT

The Northeast corner, the East one-quarter corner and the South one-quarter corner of Section 2 are on file in the County Surveyor's office.

At the West one-quarter (1/4) corner of Section 2 I found a 6" x 10" x ?" basalt stone with "1/4" scribed on the North-westerly side and an "x" on the top of the stone, from which:

A 20" Fir bears N 71° E 20.6 feet, scribe visible.

The Pine in the Southwest quadrant is blown down.

Top of East-West ridge is North approximately 30 feet.

At the North one-quarter (1/4) corner of Section 2 I found a 2 1/2" brass cap set on a 1" pipe, set in 1936 by the G.L.O. from which:

A 20" Oak bears S 57° E 34.2 feet, scar visible.

A 36" Fir bears S 19° W 31.2 feet, scribe visible.

A 2 1/2" brass cap (S 1/4 Cor. Sec. 35) bears S 85° 05' 30" W 25.82 feet
