LOCATION:

Section 26, Township 40 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, and Sections 28 and 30, Township 40 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

**PURPOSE:** 

To mark and post the Boundary lines between private land and National Forest land's and to monument certain corners as shown on the annexed map.

PROCEDURE:

U.S.C. and GS Station, Ashland Peak, was occupied, and using Dutchman Peak Lookout Tower as a back sight, distances and angles were measured either directly to controlling corners or to offsets near the controlling corners. This work was accomplished with a Hewlett Packard 3808 and 3800 Electronic measuring devices and a Kern DKM 2AE 1-second Theodolite.

Traverses were then ran along lines to be posted and closed to the controlling corners or offset points.

Offsets were then calculated from the traverse to true line. The lines were then blazed and painted and metal posts with Forest Boundary signs were set at intervisible points along the Boundary lines.

The random traverses along property lines were measured using a Kern KISE Theodolite and DM 500 and a Topcon GTS 2 Total Station.

Monuments found and used for control and monuments set by this survey are described as follows:
