

OF SURVEY OF THE SW 4 OF THE NW 4 AND THE WEST 1/2 OF THE SW 4 OF SECTION 30, T 37 5, R Z W, WILLAMETTE MERIDIAN IN JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON NOV. 8, 1983

SURVEY

The West quarter corner and the Center quarter corner were established in registered survey no. 7939 and the Southwest sixteenth corner was established in registered survey no. 8337. These corners were found to be well within the limits of permissible error for proportioned corners and were accepted as found.

These controlling corners were located by closed traverse. The desired sixteenth corners were then set by proportionate measurement as shown on the accompanying plat to which this narrative is hereby referenced.

The basis of bearing for this survey is from polaris observations taken during the course thereof.

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH O.R.S. 209.250

Located in the West half of Section 30, Township 37 South, LOCATION:

Range 2 West of the Willamette Meridian in Jackson County,

Oregon.

To establish the boundary of the combined West half of the PURPOSE:

Southwest quarter and the Southwest quarter of the Northwest

quarter of said Section 30 in preparation for a proposed

subdivision of said parcel.

All controlling section and quarter section corners had been PROCEDURE:

established prior to this survey.

At the Northwest corner of Section 30 I found a galvanized iron pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch brass cap, exposed 0.8 feet, as per Jackson County 1977. Bearing trees are in good condition.

At the North quarter corner of Section 30 I found a 1 inch iron pipe exposed 0.4 feet. One original bearing tree remains, a Black Oak, now 21 inches in diameter, with severe rot at the location of the blaze. This tree bears S600-30'E at 28.8 feet (S60°E, 43 links record).

I scribed a new bearing tree, a 14 inch Madrone. This tree bears N620-40'E at 30.70 feet.

At the South quarter corner, I found a $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch iron pipe as per registered survey no. 1673, buried 0.8 feet and located 2.2 feet North of an East - West fence.

At the Southwest corner of Section 30 I found a $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch brass cap as per Jackson County 1976, buried 0.3 feet and located above the cut bank of a shale pit extending to the East and South. Bearing trees in the Northwest and Northeast quadrants remain intact. The P. Pine to the Southeast is slive, but is located very near the edge of the shale pit. No suitable trees for scribing exist in this quadrant. The D. Fir to the Southwest is now a rotten snag in loose shale. No new trees were scribed in this quadrant as more shale excavation is planned.

I scribed 1 additional bearing tree, a 19 inch forked Madrone which bears NO60-48'W at 20.75 feet.
